Dr. Michael Gehler, born 1962 in Innsbruck, Associate Professor of Modern and Contemporary History, Institute for Contemporary History, Leopold-Franzens-University Innsbruck (1999-2006); Full Professor, University of Hildesheim, Institute for History, awarded a „Jean-Monnet Chair“ for European History from the EU-Commission (since 2006); Director of the Institute of Modern and Contemporary Historical Research of the Austrian Academy of Science (ÖAW), Vienna (2013-17); Member of the Research Team „Researching and gathering first-hand accounts with a view to writing a history of the European Commission from 1986 to 2000“ (2016-2019) and for the third time Jean Monnet-Chair for the period 2016-2019.

Research focus: History of Empires, Austrian, German and European Modern History, International Relations with special reference to the Cold War, German Unification, European Integration, Transnational Party Cooperation of Christian Democrats and Conservatives in Europe, and the South Tyrol Question.
